The ANZAC Day March next year will be the same format as every other year. However, just a further reminder, the term 'Veteran' in today's context refers to all serving and ex-



Overseas Deployments

Dear NZ Veterans in AU, thought you might be interested in knowing where our current NZDF personnel are deployed around the world.

There are currently 808 New Zealand Defence Force personnel deployed on 16 operations, UN missions and defence exercises across 12 countries, including:

- A South Sudan (3 personnel)
- B Sinai (28 personnel)
- C Middle East (8 personnel)
- D Iraq (1 person)
- *E Afghanistan (187 personnel)*
- *F* Korea (3 personnel)
- *G Timor-Leste* (78 personnel)
- H Solomon Islands (8 personnel)
- I Antarctica (0 personnel)
- *J* Bahrain (5 personnel)

Three NZDF bands to provide military music

The New Zealand Defence Force announced today its decision to fund three military bands to provide musical support at ceremonial events around the country.

The Navy Regular Force Band, based at Devonport will be responsible for providing music for all events in the upper North Island, while events in Wellington Central will be covered by the Wellington-based Air Force Territorial Force band. South Island events will have music provided by the Army Regular Force Band, based at Burnham. This band will also be used in the lower North Island, where the Air Force Territorial Force band is unable to fulfil the commitment.

As part of the structural change, seven part-time bands - four Army Territorial Force bands and three Air Force Territorial Force bands - will be no longer be funded by the New Zealand Defence Force, saving more than \$2.6 million over five years. Army and Air Force will work with the Territorial Bands around the possibility of ongoing affiliations, associations and transfer of existing bandspeople into the other trades within the Territorial Forces.

Chief of Defence Force, Lieutenant General Rhys Jones, said the new structure will ensure that the musical requirements of major ceremonial events in New Zealand will continue to be met.

"Military bands are an important part of our military history and make a significant contribution to the NZ Defence Force, New Zealand Government, and local communities. We will be prioritising events like ANZAC Day and other important occasions to ensure they still receive coverage.

"While we are adopting a new structure, military bands will continue to have a presence throughout the country and provide musical support at ceremonial events," Lieutenant General Rhys Jones says.

The decision comes after a consultation process which invited submissions on the proposed new structure. More than 130 submissions were received and considered as part of the consultation process.

Changes will be implemented by the end of June 2012.

Navy helps DoC reach Sub-Antarctic

HMNZS WELLINGTON has returned from the sub-Antarctic islands, where it helped Department of Conservation workers carry out important research on Auckland Island wildlife.

WELLINGTON transported the DoC team 465 km south from Bluff to the Auckland and Campbell Islands, New Zealand's southern-most outpost.

During the operation the ship used its RHIB (Rigid Hull Inflatible Boat) to help DOC undertake a census of the rare rockhopper penguin on the Auckland Islands, and transported DoC workers and scientists studying the island's ecology.

WELLINGTON's commanding officer, Lieutenant-Commander Rob McCaw, said supporting DoC was part of the Navy's wider role.

"As well as undertaking maritime surveillance we're here to help other government agencies – Customs, Police, Fisheries and DoC - reach the outer limits of New Zealand territory."

The Wellington recently deployed with Fisheries Officers board vessels on the outskirts of New Zealand's Exclusive Economic Zone, and was involved in the search last year for the yacht Beserk in Antarctic waters. DoC's Programme Manager for Outlying Islands, Pete McClelland, said the WELLINGTON provided the ideal platform for DoC's research.

"The Navy's two OPVs are built for this sort of thing – they have space built in for extra personnel, and cargo space on the back."

"Frankly, we couldn't do this work without the help of the Navy."

Mr McClelland said the census of penguins indicated that they are in a similar state of decline to populations on the more southerly Campbell Islands. The reason for the decline in rockhopper penguin numbers was unclear, but could be related to the fish the penguins eat moving further south as the oceans warmed.

The sub-Antarctic islands are part of the Southland DoC conservancy, but are difficult to reach because of their remoteness.

Mr McClelland said the voyage had also enabled planners writing the management plan for the islands, which will cover such issues as increasing tourist demand and introduced species management, to assess the island and its issues firsthand.

First NZ trained Bamyan Response Platoon graduates

The NZ Defence Force has helped local security forces in Bamyan Province, Afghanistan, take another step in their capacity building with the graduation of their first National Police Provincial Quick Response Force (PQRF) platoon.

Training the Afghan National Police to take over the role currently performed by NZ Defence Force military patrols is an important part of the transition strategy.

The graduating class of 28 recruits is the initial tranche of what is intended to be a company-strength of over 100 Afghans. Over the next 12 to 18 months this company will be developed by the NZ Provincial Reconstruction Team (NZPRT) and NZ Police.

Sergeant Justin Carter, a member of the NZPRT team training the PQRF, said he was impressed by the platoon's progress and their level of commitment and dedication.

"The NZPRT training team recognised very early on the importance of winning the hearts and minds of the policemen we would be training. We formed a very close professional working relationship and bond with our students."

The platoon trained for three months in a number of skill areas from the basics of first aid, navigation, radio communications and weapon handling, to comprehensive training in military tactics in order to defeat insurgent threats and respond to high risk contingencies.

Commander Joint Forces New Zealand, Major General Dave Gawn, said the PQRF has been designed, equipped and trained to be a tactical response capability for Bamyan Province.

"The PQRF are trained to a significantly higher standard in military tactics than routine Afghan National Police," he says.

"The development and training of the PQRF has progressed exceptionally well to date, but there is still a long way to go. Continued progress and momentum is required over the next one to two years to fully develop the PQRF capability."

Bamyan was the first Afghan Province to hold a transition ceremony in July 2011, marking the transfer of provincial level security and responsibility back to Afghan control. The NZ Government and the NZ Defence Force are committed to support the transition process to ensure a smooth and measured handover of responsibility.

The NZ Defence Force has played a key role in Bamyan, dating back to 2003 where it led the NZPRT for eight years. The NZPRT is currently led by civilian Director Richard Prendergast, and continues to support long term development, peace and security by facilitating reconstruction and assisting in the provision of a secure environment in Bamyan.

Air Force Orion locates missing vessel



Missing man located by RNZAF SAR

6 March 2012

A Royal New Zealand Air Force (RNZAF) P3 Orion successfully located a missing 15ft vessel in the Kiribati region yesterday.

One man was onboard the overdue vessel, which was last seen west of Banaba Island, within the local fishing ground. When located, the fisherman was standing up and waving at the Orion crew. The vessel had drifted approximately 52 nautical miles from the fishing ground.

Squadron Leader Alan Brown, who helped coordinate the search and rescue operation, said the Orion responded quickly to a request for assistance, and was able to locate the missing vessel in a short space of time.

"The New Zealand Rescue Coordination Centre (RCC) received a request for assistance from the Republic of Kiribati on the evening of 04 March, after a search conducted by local authorities resulted in no sightings," Squadron Leader Brown said.

"The Orion launched from RNZAF Base Whenuapai at 0700hrs on Monday 5 March, and located the missing vessel within 20 minutes of arriving in the search area.

"The crew were able to drop supplies, including food, water and a radio, to the man. They then located and provided guidance to a nearby fishing vessel to enable it to divert to locate the survivor.

"This was a great result for the RNZAF, and for the survivor on the vessel, who was extremely relieved to receive our assistance."

The P3 Orion is currently conducting a second search in the area.


