Unveiling of Poona War Memorial 29 October 2011

Dear Veterans, you will be aware that Alsitair Martin has been working on a memorial for Poona for a few years now and an article has been in a past NewZletter on this. Well it has been completed and on 29 October 2011, the memorial was unveiled. Article from Brian Meyer follows:

Yesterday afternoon at 3 30 pm the above memorial was unveiled and dedicated by the local Federal MP. This memorial is different from the norm as it has no long list of names likely because the small community of POONA did not exist when WW1 and 2 took place. The front of the memorial has the crests of the ADF and the NZDF and word ANZAC on the rear. Where is POONA? East of GYMPIE North of TIN CAN BAY about 230/40 km from BRISBANE. The only other ANZAC memorial that I am aware of is at the NORTH SYDNEY ANZAC Memorial Club and unfortunately the club is now defunct though the RSL Sub Br is still there and now conducts their ANZAC service at the memorial every year. In the official party was Lt Col Darren Beck RNZAC the Military Adviser at the High Commission in CANBERRA. Thank You to the POONA Community and in particular to Alastair Martin W1 who was the leader of the Sub Committee charged with getting a War Memorial for your hospitality. 
The Last Post

RESOLUTION connects with historic WWII naval battle in Solomon Islands

8 November 2011

While undertaking a hydrographic survey in Tulaghi Harbour, Solomon Islands, the crew of HMNZS RESOLUTION took time to connect with the past and remember the crew of WWII Corvette HMNZS MOA.

On 7 April 1943, Japanese aircraft sank MOA, killing five ratings and seriously wounding seven. Earlier that year, MOA assisted her sister ship KIWI take on a much bigger foe, the Japanese submarine I-1. KIWI rammed the submarine and it sank on 29 January 1943. It was the first major WWII surface action of the newly formed Royal New Zealand Navy.

American divers discovered a Japanese naval code book on board the sunken submarine. It was decoded and ultimately led allied fighters to kill Admiral Yamamoto, commander of the Japanese Imperial Navy, and the man held responsible for planning the attack on Pearl Harbour.

WWII historian Ewan Stevenson last week assisted RESOLUTION to identify and accurately position a number of WWII wrecks from his extensive historic records.

"It's been great to work with historian Ewan Stevenson to collate this detailed data on what occurred. It will be used to update navigational charts and also identify and accurately position a number of WWII wrecks and other hazards.

"Tulaghi Harbour and the Solomon Islands was the scene of many dramatic and fierce battles during WWII. HMNZS MOA played a pivotal part in the campaign against the Japanese.

"The ship's company took time to remember and honour the crew of HMNZS MOA," said Lieutenant Commander Matt Wray, Commanding Officer, HMNZS RESOLUTION.

During the survey of Tulaghi Harbour, RESOLUTION also located previously undiscovered wrecks of a US Grumman Wildcat Fighter Aircraft and a number of Landing Craft.

RESOLUTION and detachments from the Royal NZ Navy Littoral Warfare Support Group (LWSG), including the Operational Survey Unit (OSU), and Operational Diving Team (ODT) utilised high tech equipment such as the Multi Beam Echo Sounder (MBES) and the Sea Eye Falcon Remotely Operated Vehicle to collate the data.

NZ Defence Force Personnel Receive Us Medals

The service of New Zealand Defence Force personnel serving in Afghanistan as part of Operation Enduring Freedom was recognised today in a special United States medal presentation in Wellington.

US Marine Corps Major General Peter Talleri presented a Bronze Star, nine Meritorious Service medals and 15 Army Commendation medals to 25 NZ Defence Force personnel.

At the presentation Major General Talleri said, "The accomplishments of your Defence Force in Bamyan Province, Afghanistan are quite impressive. I've had the opportunity to read some of your award citations that you will be presented with today and I am truly humbled by the selfless acts and sacrifices that you have accomplished."

Among the recipients were 11 NZ Defence Force personnel who served with the New Zealand Provincial Reconstruction Team (NZPRT) in Bamyan Province, Afghanistan.

Group Captain Greg Elliott and Air Commodore Steve Moore who served as Commanders of the NZPRT in 2009 and 2006 respectively were both awarded the Meritorious Service Medal. Both men were recognised for their outstanding leadership, dedication, and the numerous accomplishments of their PRT teams.

Captain Stuart Beckman was awarded the Army Commendation Medal. His citation states that he demonstrated exceptional courage and bravery while conducting and supervising counter Improvised Explosive Device operations in a high threat environment under constant danger.

Among the recipients were also personnel who served as part of the National Support Element in Bagram, and personnel attached to the coalition training team for the Afghan National Army as well as NZ Policemen who are also Territorials, Major Grant Arrowsmith and Warrant Officer Colin Murphy, who were awarded the Army Commendation Medal for their work in Afghanistan in 2009.

Special permission had to be granted by the Governor-General for the defence personnel to wear the US medals on their uniform.

This is the second time US medals have been awarded to NZ Defence Force personnel since Vietnam. The first was in 2006 when US Ambassador William McCormick presented the United States Bronze Star Medal to ten NZ Defence Force personnel and the United States Army Commendation Medal to seven NZ Defence Force personnel at a ceremony held at the American Embassy.

Further US Award presentations will be made to a number of recipients who were not able to attend the presentation today who are either serving in Afghanistan, Timor Leste or at sea on duty.

14 November 2011 New look RSA to be launched at annual Conference At the annual RSA conference starting in Wellington today over 300 delegates will launch the new RSA brand for its second century.

"We're only five years from our 100th
anniversary," says Chief Executive Dr Stephen
Clarke, "2016 will not only be about celebrating but taking stock
of how far we have come in terms of our transformation."

The new "Living the Anzac Spirit Today" strategy challenges the RSA to transform perceptions of itself from a place which old blokes disappear into, to an organisation that is known to stand for something and is seen to play a valuable role in society. The vision is to champion the Anzac spirit across all generations, by embracing its foundation values of compassion, camaraderie, courage and commitment.

"At the heart of our new thinking is not just looking at pictures of Anzacs but celebrating, every day, that Anzac spirit living in our hearts as New Zealanders. That's how we will honour them," says Dr Clarke.

"We've been rolling out the strategy with our RSAs with positive responses and it is exciting to be launching the new look

this week. It really is a first for the RSA," he says.

Dr Clarke said the public will begin to see the new approach from next April.

The 2011 annual report reveals that RSA membership this year has increased to 117,000 members, making it still one of the largest voluntary organisations in the country.

These and other matters will be covered in National President Don McIver's inaugural address together with addresses from the Governor-General and the Prime Minister at this afternoon's Formal Opening. The Opening will also be the first for Corporal Willie Apiata VC since being made a RNZRSA Life Member in 2007
